Brian must construct a winter shelter, build snow shoes, survive an attack by a bear, and learn how to make a bow more powerful. Eventually, Brian meets a family of Cree trappers who help him return home. Various areas such as reading comprehension, vocabulary development, spelling, grammar, and writing are all entwined in this integrated approach, eliminating the need for teaching these skills separately.
