The Stationers Company A History

In 1606 the Stationers expanded to new premises at Abergavenny House on the site of the present Hall. In 1666 the Great Fire destroyed Stationers' Hall along with the major part of the City of London. George Tokefield, the Clerk, managed to remove most of the Company's records to his house in Clerkenwell, for which thoughtful act the Company is indebted for the survival of its unique archive.

The Stationers' Register was a record book maintained by the Stationers' Company of London. The company is a trade guild given a royal charter in 1557 to regulate the various professions associated with the publishing industry, including printers, bookbinders, booksellers, and publishers in England.

Originally the term stationery referred to all products sold by a stationer, whose name indicated that his book shop was on a fixed spot, usually near a university, and permanent, while medieval trading was mainly carried on by itinerant peddlers (including chapmen, who sold books) and others (such as farmers and craftsmen) at markets and fairs.

Stationers Hall

The Worshipful Company of Stationers and Newspaper Makers, usually known as the Stationers' Company, is one of the livery companies of the City of London. The Stationers' Company was formed in 1403; it received a royal charter in 1557. It held a monopoly over the publishing industry and was officially responsible for setting and enforcing regulations until the enactment of the Statute of Anne, also known as the Copyright Act of 1710. The Stationers' Company, founded in 1403 and incorporated in 1557, dominated London's trade in printed books during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries; following the loss of its monopoly over printing in 1695, its regulatory powers diminished, but it retained a vital role in the life of the London trade, not least through its lucrative joint-stock publishing venture, known as the 'English Stock'.

The Stationers' Company has had a corporate existence, under one name or another, for over five hundred and fifty years. At some periods in its life it was of importance only to its own members; at others it played parts of some consequence in the history of the City of London and even in the history of England.

The Stationers' Company was a dominant force in the English book trade throughout the early modern period. With few exceptions, one could not be a successful printer or bookseller in post-1557 England without having some kind of relationship with the Company.

The History of the Company In 1403 the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of London approved the formation of a fraternity or Guild of Stationers (booksellers who copied and sold manuscript books and writing materials and limners who decorated and illustrated them). By the early 16th century printers had joined the Stationers' Company and by the mid-century had more or less ousted the manuscript trade.
